Findings of the report (2)

Registration

- 31 registered initiatives
- Wide range of topics: e.g. environment, mobility, education, development cooperation, social issues
- 20 requests refused: manifestly outside the framework of Commission's powers





Collection

- Data based on the three successful initiatives
- Overall 55% collected online:

Initiative	Statements of support collected on paper	Statements of support collected online
Right2Water	Around 20%	Around 80%
One of us	Around 70%	Around 30%
Stop vivisection	Around 40%	Around 60%



Findings of the report (7)

- Online collection:
 - 21 collected online
 - All used the software provided by the Commission
 - Server issues: all but 2 initiatives used the Commission's exceptional hosting offer





Findings of the report (8)

Verification of statements of support

- Overall almost 90% of the collected statements were found valid.
- Similar results for paper-based and online statements
- Random sampling used by 17 Member States



Findings of the report (9)

Submission and examination by Commission

•Right2water:

- >1.65 M (thresholds reached in 13 countries)
- 17 February 2014: Meeting with COM and Public Hearing in EP
- 19 March 2014: Communication from the Commission

-> positive answer: COM proposed a series of followup actions

Findings of the report (10)

•One of us:

- >1,72 M (thresholds reached in 18 countries)
- 9-10 April 2014: Meeting with COM and Public Hearing in EP
- 28 May 2014: Communication from the Commission

-> COM decided not to take action, considering that the existing legislative framework was the appropriate one.





•Stop vivisection:

• >1,17 M (thresholds reached in 9 countries) Submitted to the Commission on 3 March 2015

[After the adoption of the report:

- 11 May: Meeting with COM and Public Hearing in EP
- 3 June: Communication from the Commission

-> COM proposed a series of follow-up actions]



Challenges identified (1)

- Lack of legal personality for citizens' committees
- Registration: almost 40% of initiatives could not be registered
- Requirements for signatories: varying from MS to MS -> some citizens excluded



Challenges identified (2)

•Timeline:

- Collection period (often less than 12 months due to the setting-up of the online collection system)
- No time limit for the submission

Translations

•Online collection: hosting issue, complex certification procedure, dissatisfaction with the Commission software, Member States uncomfortable with the possibility to certify systems before the initiative registration

Challenges identified (3)

- Public hearings in the European Parliament: need to ensure that different views and perspectives are heard.
- Need for more interaction between organisers and the Commission
